You Need To Know!

Record Book Deadline—June 30th

Just a reminder—

All officer (Treasurer's—if your club has any income or disbursements, and Secretary books are mandatory), project and record books are due in the 4-H Office by 5:00 PM on June 30th, 2007. If you have turned in a record book during the County Fair, and would like to improve your score, you can make corrections, add photo's, add to your story, correct any math errors and resubmit it by June 30th. However, it is not necessary to resubmit your book again if you did not make any improvements.

Attention Club Leaders

Now is the time to get with your club officers to make sure their officer record books are complete and up-to-date. They are due on **June 30th**. Treasurer's—if your club has any income or disbursements, and Secretary book are mandatory.

MOST IMPORTANT: Club Treasurers your clubs end-of-the-year bookkeeping is due. Your club is required to turn in an "Annual 4-H Club Financial Report" and "Auditor's Report" (both forms are found in your treasurers record book pages 33 & 34) along with your treasurers record book and all supporting documents.

Leaders, please review your copy of the "4-H Club Policy & Procedures for Sarasota County" found in the front of your Leader Handbook. If you have any question or need help please contact the 4-H Office at 861-9818.

Junior, Intermediate & Senior Recognition Forms

Junior, Intermediate & Senior Recognition Forms are due June 30th, 2007, by 5:00 PM. Forms are available at the 4-H Office. Any 4-H youth wishing to be considered for a county project medal must complete this form.

Attention 4-H Seniors... don't miss this deadline!

Senior 4-H State Portfolios are due **May 18th, by 5:00 PM**. Seniors must complete a portfolio if they wish to be considered for State 4-H Recognition, or a State 4-H Scholarship.

This month the Reef Rovers went on a field trip to Ken Thompson Park where we participated in water quality-testing and dip netting, led by Karen Fraley of Around-The-Bend Nature Tours. We found lots of interesting creatures like blue crabs, shrimp and pin fish. And we went on a walk through the mangrove tunnels at the park, learning to identify different plants. During water quality testing, we learned about pH and oxygen levels.

Afterwards, we got a great behind-the-scenes tour of Mote Aquarium's Marine Mammal Rehabilitation Center. We saw lots of recovering sea turtles, including Lucky, a young sea turtle that was sucked up a dredging pipe. Soon after our visit, she was released back into the bay. We also got a sneak peek at Filly, a young female dolphin who is a resident of Sarasota Bay. She had fishing line wrapped so tightly around her fluke; it had begun to cut into the bone. Now Filly is healthy and happy, back in the bay.

We are also still working on our Bat Buddies project. We are continuing to develop a presentation we plan to deliver to elementary schools to teach kids about bats and bat houses. And we will install the rest of our bat houses late April.

Kids that Care Project: by Sean Russell

Over the course of this past year 4-H members from across Sarasota County have pledged their heads, hearts, hands, and health to making the best better in the community through the county-wide "Kids that Care" project. This project focused on helping our community through beach cleanups, working with children at the Salvation Army Family Ward, collecting items for the Humane Society, and brightening the lives of the people living at the Pines of Sarasota Assisted Living Facility.

The "Kids that Care" project began at the August County Council Meeting when the project was voted in. Sandra Washington, from Keep Sarasota County Beautiful, attended this meeting and talked to the 4-Hers present about the importance of beach cleanups, one aspect of the new project.

At the September County Council Meeting, Kate Franklin, the director of education at the Sarasota County Humane Society, talked to 4-Hers about ways they could help the animals living at the Humane Society. The 4-H members at this meeting decorated collection boxes that were taken to clubs to collect items for the Humane Society and for our Salvation Army projects. Also in September, 4-Hers from the Green Team, Horse N' Around, and Myakka Allstock participated in the Florida Coastal Cleanup at Turtle Beach. The members from these clubs picked up a large quantity of litter and helped to clean up the environment.

In November, 4-H members began to plan their first visit to the Pines of Sarasota Assisted Living Facility. 4-Hers involved in this aspect of the Kids that Care program decided to put together a talent show for the residents living there. At the November council meeting, members signed up for the talent show and everyone there made Christmas cards to be distributed when we visited the assisted living facility.

On December 4th Sarasota County 4-Hers made their first visit to the Salvation Army Family Ward. 4-H organizers of this event put together a Christmas party for the children living there. The children decorated Christmas ornaments, listened to a Christmas story, received gifts that had been collected all year by 4-H members, and had a snack time. All of the families who participated thoroughly enjoyed this Christmastime visit.

Also in December, 4-Hers went to the Pines of Sarasota and put on a lunchtime Christmas performance. These 4-H members sang, played the piano, and danced as well as passed out the Christmas cards that had been made in November. Since the residents like the performance so much we promised to come back again.

Starting in January we began our collection of items for the Sarasota County Humane Society. At the January County Council meeting we made dog toys to give to the Humane Society as well as Valentine's cards to take on our next visit to the nursing Pines of Sarasota Assisted Living Facility.

On February 12th 4-H members made their second visit to the Pines of Sarasota Assisted Living Facility. Here, once again, we put on a talent show for the residents and passed out the Valentine's cards that had been made for them. At the February County Council Meeting 4-Hers made Easter Cards to give out to the residents of the Pines of Sarasota on the next visit which was scheduled on a Sunday one week before Easter.

During the month of March, Sarasota County 4-Hers continued to work on project "Kids that Care". They put together a collection box to put in the Mini-Building at the Sarasota County Fair to collect items to be donated to the Humane Society. They also collected money to donate to the Humane Society.

On April 1st another visit was made to the Pines of Sarasota. This time 4-Hers put together another talent show which showcased many participants from the Share the Fun competition at the Fair. At the end of the performance, 4-Hers passed out Easter cards that had been made by County Council members and the Green Team 4-H club. The residents greatly appreciated our visit.

The next part of the Kids that Care project took place in April. It was 4-H's second visit to the Salvation Army family ward. This time, 4-Hers hosted an Easter party for the families living there. The children made Easter windsocks, died Easter eggs, and had an Easter story time. They also enjoyed a snack. The party ended with an outside Easter egg hunt on the playground! All of the children and their parent greatly appreciated the party. They especially liked dying the Easter eggs and the Easter egg hunt.



After collecting items for the Humane Society from January till April, a group of county council officers delivered the items and the money that had been donated for the Humane Society to Kate Franklin. She was extremely appreciative of what had been brought in and thanked us for our efforts. While we were there, she gave us a tour of the Humane Society and showed us the animals that would benefit from this project.

The final part of the Kids that Care project took place on April 13th. This was another beach cleanup at Turtle Beach through the Keep Sarasota County Beautiful program. At this cleanup, all who participated worked, hard to make our community a cleaner, healthier place to live.

As your County Council President, I would like to say thank you to all who participated in the Kids that Care project this year. Thanks for filling the boxes and bags with items for the Salvation Army and Humane Society. Thanks for making cards and dog toys at county council meetings. Thanks for attending beach cleanups and working hard to protect the environment. Thanks for performing and visiting with the residents at the Pines of Sarasota Assisted Living Facility. Thanks brightening the lives of families at the Salvation Army Family Ward. This project could not have been done with out your support.

At this time I would also like to thank Florida 4-H for awarding our project a Community Pride Grant. The monies from this award as well as the items donated by other 4-H clubs and leaders, and the 4-H office, together with what 4-H members contributed made this project a huge success!

All who have participated in this project have shown that by working together with your heads, hearts, hands, and health, you CAN make a difference in the lives of people living in your community.
