Plant Entry Forms—Plant show and sale entry *forms "A" only* are due on Friday, October 9th, 2009 by 5PM at the **FAIR OFFICE**. You can turn your forms in earlier if you have completed them - they will not accept late entries, or a fax! Form "B" (classes 41 & 42) are due February 5th, 2010.



Plant Screening—A Plant Screening will be conducted by members of the Florida Nursery Growers Association, on Saturday, November 7th from 9:00 AM - Noon at the Fair (Potter Building Parking lot). Plants will be checked and identified, record books **MUST BE** up-to-date. All exhibitors must be present with their plants and record book—**attendance is mandatory**.

Please note: Each exhibitor is eligible to enter and sell in a maximum of **TWO LOTS** in any **ONE CLASS**, not to exceed a **TOTAL** number of six (6) lots, **FOR A FINAL TOTAL OF ACTUAL INDIVIDUAL CONTAINERS OF PLANTS TO NOT EXCEED TEN (10) MAXIMUM**. THE NUMBER OF ENTRIES FROM ANY LOTS AND SETS WITHIN...FROM PART A FORM + PART B FORM... **MUST NOT EXCEED MORE THAN TEN (10) INDIVIDUAL CONTAINERS OF PLANTS**.

Attention All Plant Exhibitors: The six (6) lot rule will be strictly enforced this year. The rule has been in effect for 6 years but not enforced. Our show has grown in the last few years, and this rule enforcement will help speed up our sale, and keep everyone on an even keel as far as the sale order.

Horse 'N Around had a great meeting on September 22^d 2009! We have three new members: Gabby and her brother Jude, and Zoey, a clover bud. I did a short demonstration on stop motion animation, explaining and showing how to make short animated movies using a digital camera and Lego® or clay.

One of our service projects this year is to raise money for Heifer International by selling beeswax candles at the 20th annual Fruitville Grove Pumpkin Festival. So, at our meeting, we made tapered candles by rolling sheets of natural beeswax. We tied them up in pairs with raffia, and we'll be selling them at Fruitville Grove (7410 Fruitville Road in Sarasota) starting October 10th. In the end, we made about 90 pairs in various fall colors; it was a lot of fun!

4-Hers Learn GPS Applications

With the professional guidance of engineer / 4-H leader Scott Britt, 4-H teens had the unique opportunity to learn GPS mapping techniques. Jarrod Chapman, Devin Payne and Tatum Britt were able to use engineering technology to produce an aerial map of Midnight Pass, Sarasota which displayed a comparison of growth boundaries for mangrove habitats between 1948 and 1995. The actual map they created is available for review at our 4-H Office. Thank you Scott and your staff for training these 4-Hers in this field of science and technology.

On September 3rd, the 4H office organized a fish printing workshop. Fish printing comes from the Japanese art of Gyotaku: in the 19th century, before there were cameras, Japanese fishermen used Gyotaku to record the exact size and species of their catches. It has become an art form now, both in Japan and other countries. Instead of real fish, we used life size rubber replicas of various fish and other sea creatures. We applied paint to the replicas, and pressed the t-shirt on top of it to obtain a fish print.

I can't wait for the next workshop, on October 1st, where we will make fence-post pumpkins, to put outside as fall decorations. If you haven't tried any of these workshops, I recommend you do, they're very fun and informative, and there's one every month!

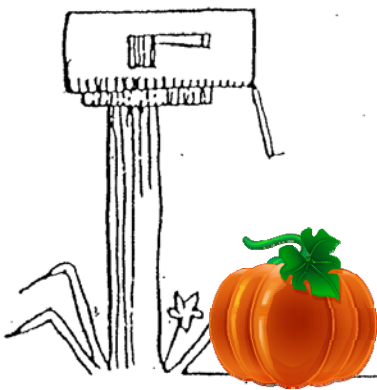
